



Tours: The Christmas Party. Sun Dec 9, Coronado Golf Club.



New Business: Gifts were presented to all of the major volunteer leaders for the "Big Three"








On Display-V8 All Ford Picnic Award?







A Model T, abandoned as Paradise burned, emerges with barely a scratch.



As a wildfire bore down on Paradise, Calif., the owner of a 1915 Ford left the car behind, saying, "It's stupid to risk a life for a Model T when there's so many people trying to evacuate." But the blaze left the car almost untouched.—Eric Thayer for The New York Times

PARADISE, Calif. — Ron Westbrook's house is gone. The burned hull of a washer is visible in the rubble. A mangled satellite dish, too. In his collapsed garage, two cars, including a beloved 1941 Plymouth, are no more than blackened shells.

But at the end of Mr. Westbrook's driveway, in the shade of charred pines, a 103-year-old Ford Model T somehow escaped with only minor paint damage, standing out like a museum piece in a vast landscape of destruction.

The wooden steering wheel, the leather bench seat, the brassy grill, even the



for-sale sign on the back — "Runs Very Well," it attests — were left untouched as the Camp Fire tore an indiscriminate path through the town of Paradise. For Mr. Westbrook, 74, the car's survival was only slight comfort. Like most other Paradise residents, he has been through hell. The fire has scorched 135,000 acres, killed at least 56 people and left the quiet town of retirees uninhabitable.

"Just losing the house is one thing," said Mr. Westbrook, who does not plan to rebuild. "But when you lose your whole town, it's kind of overwhelming."

The old car's fate is now fairly low on his list of concerns. There is insurance paperwork to deal with. Temporary lodging to find. A new life to prepare for, somewhere beyond Paradise.







"FROM BUMPER TO TAILITE"

Two men from South Bend, Indiana sold the patent rights for their electric beudlamp to a man from Fostoria, Ohio. In 1911 his Auto-liter Company was sold to Willys Overland. In 1918 C.O. Mininger bought back the Electric Auto-Lite Corporation

By 1927 Electric Auto-Lite had battery manufacturing plants in eight U.S. cities and six foreign countries. This included USL, the makers of Auto-Lite and Presto-O-Lite of Indianapolis.

In 1936 Electric Auto-Lite entered the highly competitive spark plug market with a plant in Fostoria. Their big customer was Chrysler. This plant employed 60% women although the

management was probably all men (much smarter, you know). In 1954 during an economic restructuring, the hyphen was removed and the name became just Autolite.

In 1961 Ford bought the rights to the Autolite name as well as the battery plant in Owosso, Michig and much to the disappointment of Champion, the spark plug facility in Fostoria. Between 1962 and 1970 the Ohio plant produced over one billion spark plugs. In 1973 an antitrust suit forced the sale of Autolite and Ford revised the Motorcraft brand which had

actually been introduced rather unsuccessfully in the 1950's.

So as not to keep you in "Suspense", Autolite (Fram & Prestone too) is today part of giant Honeywell.

In the fall of 1949 Ford launched this major promotion: "Come in for a free safety cheek. "Come in" for a free license plate attachment. "Come in" for an official cutry blank at the bottom of which you were asked to indicate your interest in a Ford car or truck.

Prizes for the Car Safety Contest included 25 new cars, 5 new trucks and \$38,000 in savings bonds. Total-\$100,000.

This reflective topper (we'll call it a sider) must not have been too popular, because it is fairly easy to find and not real expensive.





What is a Prest-O-lite? In 1913 when James Allison, builder o the Indianapolis Motor Speedway and Carl Fisher sold it to Union Carbide for 9 million bucks Prest-O-lite was a gas cylin used to fuel automobile headlamps.

GENUINE FORD BATTERY

I cannot find the date that it became a storage battery, but in 1927 it became the property of Electric Auto-lite.

I believe that most or all of the Ford script batteries were made by Auto-lite owned companies and I know that most or maybe all of the cases were made by Richardson Rubber and R.F. Goodrich, both with plants in Indianapolis.

When Ford was forced to sell it's Autolite operations in 1961, the battery plant

in Owosso was sold to Giobe-Union who became a battery supplier for Motorcraft.

Prestolite is today a giant supplier of electrical components and the parent company of

Mr. Ginklet, Accel, Hayes, Mallory, and others.

After the big sale, Allison and Fisher went their separate ways. Allison started a company called Allison Experimental which is today Rolla-Royce Aerospace and Allison Transmission. Fisher went to Florida and invested in Miami Beach. He was wiped out by booze and a major hurricane.


