Margaret Dunning: 1910-2015 - By: Jeff Peek

Margaret Dunning, the car-loving centenarian who became something of a celebrity and earned the nickname "Belle of the Concours" after showing her 1930 Packard in the 2012 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, has died. Dunning, of Plymouth, Mich., 2012 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, has died. Dunning, of Plymouth, Mich., would have celebrated her 105th birthday next month. She died after being injured in a fall while participating in the ELK Charity Challenge, a fundraiser in California that benefits three children's charities. Earlier in the week, Dunning visited Jay Leno's extensive car collection, and Leno changed his plans so that he could be there to greet her. "No matter how many great people you cross paths with, Margaret was one of those extraordinary individuals you meet once in a lifetime," said automotive writer Michel Lamoureux, who became friends with Dunning several years ago. "One of the most meaningful things she ever told me was that it's important to savor life in real time – to enjoy what you do while you're at it." Dunning was born June 26, 1910, just a few miles from Henry Ford's Detroit-area home. Her parents, Charles and Bessie Dunning, told her that Ford would sometimes stop by their farm house to visit, and he once rocked her to sleep. Dunning's connection to the automotive legend may have been an omen. She said she was a "tomboy" as a kid and served as a "tool chaser" for her car-loving father, who taught her to drive at the age of 8. Dunning earned a driver's license at 12, and she continued to drive well past her 100th birthday. "Oh, yes, I've driven my share, that's for sure," Dunning said during a recent interview. "It's one of my favorite things to do."

Her favorite car to drive was the cream-colored 1930 Packard 740 Custom Eight Roadster that she purchased in 1949. "I love third gear; the car just sings," she said. "I've never used it as my everyday driver, but I do like to get it out at least once a month. They were made to be driven, you know.





In theory, I was supposed to be on vacation — a long-overdue escape from the ceaseless to-do list at home, the cries of a vintage car fleet waiting to emerge from a long Northeast winter, and a respite from the adventurous life of a Hemmings editor before real spring weather brings forth a new show and photo shoot season. So, with great anticipation, my ever-supportive wife and I boarded a flight and headed to the desert Southwest — more specifically, northern Arizona — to take in a week of nature's beauty, which had been on our bucket list. Within a day on the ground, it was mission accomplished: I had not given one second of thought to anything that was patiently waiting for my return. Even vintage cars. That is, until we turned a corner in the Painted Desert and my eyes fell upon the relic from the past pictured above (and below). Quicker than a Wood Brothers pit stop at Indy in 1965, I threw the rental car's transmission into park and was taking pictures of the accidental find. Like a kid in a candy store, I traced its abandoned, well-weathered lines with my eyes, looking for that one clue that would trigger a memory as to its identity. As it turns out, this four-door sedan was purposely positioned on a stretch of terra firma where Route 66 once ran. Note the

V8ers on the loose at the excellent Air Museum in Palm Springs.



















Edsel and Eleanor Ford, Henry and Clara Ford, and Mina and Thomas Edison on the Private Railroad Car "Fair Lane," circa 1923 By 1920, Henry and Clara Ford found it increasingly difficult to travel with any degree of privacy. They purchased a private railcar and named it "Fair Lane." The car had four private rooms, an observation lounge, a dining room and a fully equipped kitchen. The cost to purchase and upscale the car into a luxury travel private car was \$150,000 in 1921 dollars. At 82' x 12', the business car 73'6" of living space and is equipped with such luxuries solid walnut walls, beveled mirrors and door glass, plus hand carved columnar facades. Many famous passengers have traveled in this car: Presidents Harding and Coolidge both campaigned off the observation deck. Numerous industrialists and manufacturers including Ford's close personal friend, Thomas Edison were frequent passengers. With a grand dinning room, four staterooms and 5 bathrooms, it could accommodate eight, including sleep overs in stationary brass beds. The couple made over 400 trips using "Fair Lane" before selling the passenger car in






