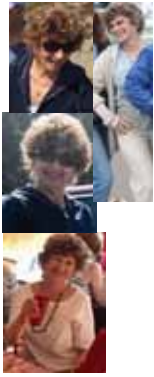

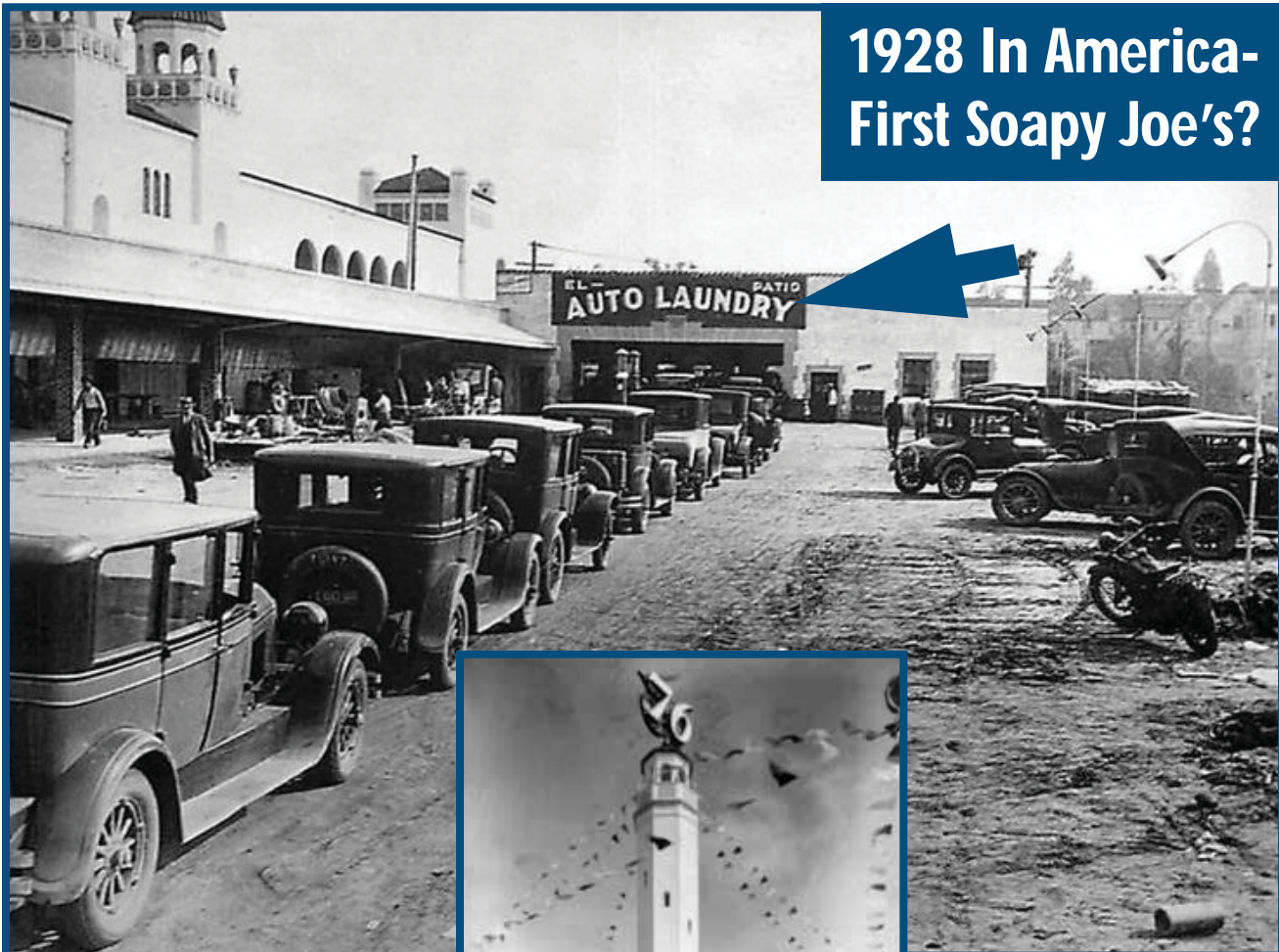

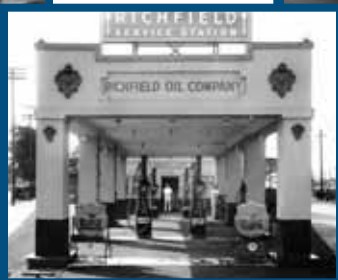

Harris Caves of Mystery Tour



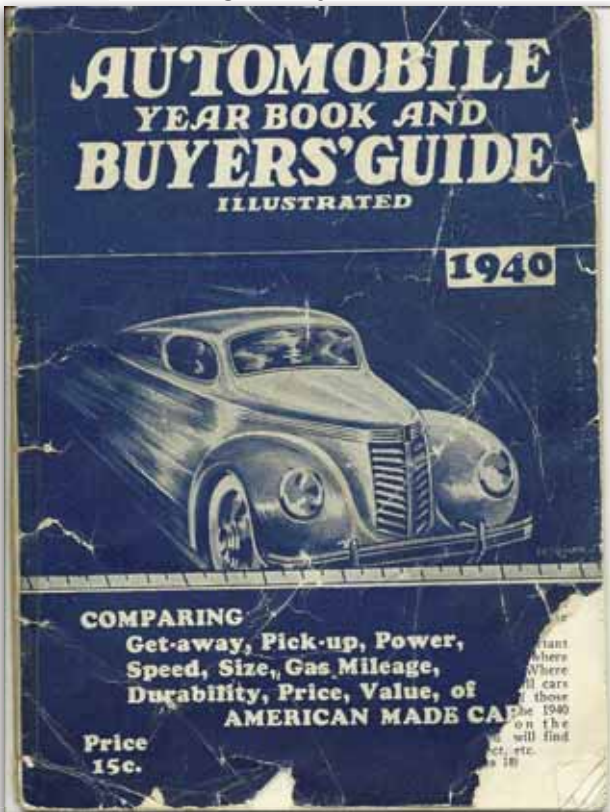
Jay- still up to his old tricks-

Recommended Reading: Automobile Year Book and Buyer's Guide 1940

All the information you need, and a whole lot more, when buying a 1940 automobile. Photos by author.

This 34-page softcover dynamo is packed with more detailed information than you ever thought could be available, and that you would want to know. When it comes to cars built for the 1940 model year, every single part type, specification, and performance figure is included within this book's compact 5 x 7-inch size. And we're talking highly detailed information for all American-made cars, not just a select few.

Thanks to reader Bob Goulding who kindly sent me this copy, from the second I flipped over its tattered cover I was amazed as to the book's content. It takes the term "hardcore" to a whole new level, with its compilation of facts and figures the likes of which I have never seen before.

For more insight, the book's opening paragraphs explain it all:

"It would, of course, be impossible to get all these parts together for comparison, but you can rely upon the Automobile Year Book and Buyers' Guide for the same information you would get from first-hand comparison.
