


Doctor Joe Bean's Intense Eggnog

- 14 Eggs
- 1 Cup Sugar
- 6 Oz. Light Rum
- 1 Bottle (1/5) Bourbon
- 1 Quart Half & Half
- 1 Quart Whipping Cream
- 8 Rounded Tsp of Sugar
- 2 Tsp Vanilla

Nutmeg

Directions:



Use the mixer to beat the egg yolks until smooth and frothy (5 to 10 minutes).

In a separate bowl, use the mixer to beat the whites until VERY STIFF. As they are getting stiff, gradually add 1 cup of sugar.

When stiff, add the yolks *slowly* while still beating.

Continue beating while **slowly** adding the booze. This should take a couple of minutes.

Now add the 1 quart of half and half, gradually, while still beating.

In a separate bowl, beat 1 pint whipping cream until stiff and add 4 rounded teaspoons of sugar and one teaspoon vanilla. Fold into the egg stuff in small doses. Then **Chill!!!**

To serve: beat the other pint of whipping cream with sugar and vanilla, same as above. Fold into mix by teaspoons (or just fold a dollop into cup. Ladle into punch cups and sprinkle with nutmeg. ENJOY!
